Misuse of Prescription Drugs

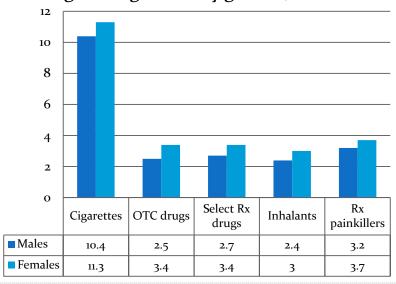
- The 2010 Alcohol, Tobacco and Other Drug Use (ATOD) by Indiana Children and Adolescents survey asked participants in grades 6-12 "have you ever used prescription drugs (such as Ritalin, Adderall, Xanax) to get high?"
- The results showed that 6 % of Indiana's 10th and 11th graders and 7 % of 12th graders reported past month use of prescription drugs such as Ritalin, Adderall and Xanax to get high.
- The percentage of Indiana 12th graders who reported lifetime use of prescription drugs was 14.6 %.

Behavior Survey -more than
22 % of high school students
in Indiana reported use of a
prescription drug such as
OxyContin, Percocet,
Vicodin, Adderall, Ritalin or
Xanax without a doctor's
prescription at some time in
their lives.



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Monthly use of tobacco and other drugs: 8th graders by gender, 2010



The chart above shows differences in monthly substance use prevalence between males and females. Among 8th graders, more females than males reported using the following drugs: cigarettes, over-the-counter drugs, prescription drugs (Ritalin, Adderall, Xanax), inhalants, prescription painkillers (Vicodin, OxyContin, Percocet), and alcohol.
